CRA ADVOCATES FOR THE VULNERABLE DURING PANDEMIC

CRA has joined a coalition of Catholic organisations who have written a <u>letter to the Prime Minister</u> and several Ministers advocating for the most vulnerable people in our community to receive government support as the impacts of COVID-19 continue to wreak havoc.

This includes 1.5 million temporary visa holders; people who have or are losing their jobs, who have no access to any form of financial safety net, to Medicare, to temporary shelter, and to fundamental support services such as free legal advice. This includes women who are victims of trafficking and victims of modern slavery, people seeking asylum, and women on temporary visas experiencing domestic violence.

JOBKEEPER PACKAGE TO INCLUDE A NEW CATEGORY OF 'RELIGIOUS PRACTITIONERS'

Representations to Government have been successful in extending the JobKeeper package to include a new category of 'religious practitioners,' announced Friday, 24 April 2020. This appears to recognise that religious are not 'employees.'

Further discussions with the ATO will continue this week to obtain more details and to discuss the correct terminology to ensure that there is no risk to the non-employee status of religious.
