#### **GRANT APPLICATION OPENED FOR ONGOING BUSHFIRE RECOVERY**

Catholic Emergency Relief Australia has opened the first round of applications for grants to support the ongoing recovery from the devastating bushfires of the summer of 2019/2020. The funds are geared especially towards trauma and grief counselling, as well as other mental and emotional support, along with community-building initiatives. Read the <u>media release</u>.

#### PASTORAL LETTER FROM THE MOST REV TIMOTHY COSTELLOE SDB

In November 2019 the WA Government introduced the *Children and Community Services Amendment Bill* (2019). Under the proposed legislation changes, Catholic priests would be required to report child sexual abuse that was disclosed to them during the Sacrament of Penance, breaking the Seal of Confession.

Simone McGurk, Minister for Child Protection; Women's Interests; Prevention of Family and Domestic Violence and Community Services in WA made a direct "call" to the Archbishop of Perth, Timothy Costelloe SDB to support the legislation. #### CAPSA TOOLKIT FOR REFUGEE ACTION

Catholic Alliance for People Seeking Asylum (CAPSA) tells us that people seeking asylum on bridging visas and other temporary visa holders still do not have access to a safety net while navigating through the adverse effects of the COVID-19 pandemic. #### **NEW REPORT ON NUCLEAR SPENDING FROM ICAN**

According to International Campaign to Abolish Nuclear weapons (ICAN), nine nuclear armed states spent roughly \$73 billion on their nuclear arsenals last year – that is \$138,699 per minute. This estimate includes costs to maintain current nuclear warheads and nuclear delivery systems, and to develop and build new ones. ## **REVIEW OF CHURCH GOVERNANCE**

A 200-page review of Church governance containing 86 recommendations was tabled at the bishops' plenary meeting last week. The review was commissioned by the ACBC and prepared by the Governance Review Project Team. The bishops will consider the report and the recommendations in the coming months, with a view to publishing the report and their response later this year. Read the <u>media release</u>.

The report identifies key principles of good ecclesial governance, such as subsidiarity, stewardship, synodality, dialogue, discernment, and leadership. It may contribute to the formation of proposals to be considered during the Plenary Council.

# **VOLUNTEERS NEEDED**

Catholic Healthcare provides social support to elderly clients via volunteer phone calls and they are seeking volunteers who have interest and skills in providing pastoral care.

Pastoral Care Volunteers (PCVs) are matched to one client, whom they phone weekly or fortnightly on a day and time which is mutually convenient. The nature of the phone calls is primarily social, though PCVs can provide discussion on church/religious matters and provide prayers depending on client interest. While attendance at church services remains limited, many clients will value the opportunity to join with someone in prayer – even if just on the phone. This is particularly important during COVID-19 restrictions.
