FUNDING BOOST FOR GROUPS HELPING WITH BUSHFIRE RECOVERY

The first round of grants from Catholic Emergency Relief Australia (CERA) has been awarded to support the ongoing recovery from last summer's bushfires. With at least \$100,000 available, 24 groups applied for approximately \$400,000 in funding to support various programs and projects across New South Wales, Victoria and South Australia. Fifteen organisations were successful in seeking grants, receiving a total of \$110,000 to support trauma counselling and mental health, as well as community-building initiatives.
