# WORKING DOCUMENT NEXT STEP ON PLENARY COUNCIL JOURNEY

Work has commenced on the preparation of the *instrumentum laboris*, or 'working document', for the Plenary Council, which draws on the voices of the more than 220,000 people who contributed to the Listening and Dialogue stage and the responses during the Listening and Discernment stage, including <u>the thematic papers released at Pentecost</u>. The *instrumentum laboris* is described as the next step in the years-long process and will help shape the agenda for the first assembly of the Council, now scheduled for October 2021.
