- Vatican News <u>SUPER NUNS</u>: the fearless sisters fighting human trafficking. On Saturday, 8 February 2020, Pope Francis viewed the new anti-human trafficking campaign "Super Nuns". Street art and new social media platforms are now working to support and raise awareness of Catholic Sisters' work to stop human trafficking. Pat Murray IBVM, Executive Secretary of International Union of Superiors General (UISG), and Gabriella Bottani SMC, International Coordinator of Talitha Kum, appear in the Vatican News article above. Talitha Kum is the name of the anti-human trafficking project of UISG.
