HOLY SEE OFFERS OBSERVATIONS ON ROYAL COMMISSION RECOMMENDATIONS

The Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse made 49 recommendations in its final report that were addressed to the Catholic Church. Of those, 12 called for referral to, or consultation with, the Holy See because they relate to universal Church law or practice.

Earlier this year, the Holy See provided its observations regarding these recommendations to the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference (ACBC). The observations were discussed by the bishops at their plenary meeting in May. They have since been provided to the Attorney-General of Australia.

The Holy See's observations have just been published on the Royal Commission page of the <u>ACBC website</u>. The <u>ACBC media release</u> will be the only comment the ACBC makes regarding the subject.

The Government will vote on a bill next month to pass the <u>National Radioactive Waste Management</u> <u>Amendment Bill</u>. <u>Friends of the Earth</u> claim that the bill would strip Barngarla Traditional Owners and other interested parties of their rights to a judicial review of the nuclear waste dump proposal.
