UISG EMERGENCY FUNDS – COVID-19

The International Union of Superiors General (UISG) has received new funds to support religious congregations in various parts of the world suffering the impact of COVID-19 (€5,000 max). Photos and a paragraph describing the impact of the pandemic on the community/ministry are required. Australia is in Constellation APME Pacific C6 – this is needed if filling in the form. See the message and form from UISG.

The funding could apply to a particular part of a province or congregation, this could include Pacific Island communities which are struggling. 300 YEAR JUBILEE OF THE PASSIONISTS

On Sunday 22 November 2020, the Passionist Congregation held the Jubilee for its 300 years of foundation. It began with the opening of the Holy Door of the Basilica of St. John and Paul in Rome and continued with a Mass at which the Vatican Secretary of State, Cardinal Pietro Parolin, was the principal celebrant. MCCARRICK REPORT

Prepared by the Holy See, the <u>400-page McCarrick Report</u>, published on 10 November 2020, has been widely debated but <u>"an open letter to the bishops, from a young Catholic who's only known a church in scandal</u> demonstrates just how important the safeguarding of children and adults at risk is, and how crucial it is to embed safeguarding into the mission of every religious organisation.

MODERN SLAVERY ACT 2018 - NSW GOVERNMENT IN CONTEMPT OF THE HOUSE

In a debate on 18 November 2020 regarding the failure to proclaim the Modern Slavery Act 2018, a motion was passed finding the NSW Government in contempt of the House. Don Harwin MLC in the debate. The third and final paragraphs of the speech summarise the NSW Government's position on the matter of the proclamation of the Modern Slavery Act 2018. This short story, <u>Lasallian Vocation: Following the Star</u>, provides a glimpse into the ministry of a young Lasallian Brother in a school setting in Sydney, offering senior students different avenues into spirituality and Christian faith and serving those with special needs.

PEACE BOAT HIBAKUSHA PROJECT ONLINE

A new project has been launched as the next step forward, following the commemoration of the 75th anniversary of Hiroshima and Nagasaki atomic bombing and the 50th ratification of the Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons (TPNW).

"Every Second Counts for the Survivors! Peace Boat Hibakusha Project Online" plans to hold online Hibakusha testimony sessions in more than 190 countries and regions to gain greater support for the Hibakusha's plea and the TPNW. Hibakusha are people affected by the 1945 Hiroshima and Nagasaki atomic bombings, who are aging and whose time is limited. Started in October 2020, the plan is for 100 such events to be held by the end of 2021. Visit the <u>peace boat website</u> for more information.

JOIN ACRATH IN 16 DAYS OF ACTIVISM

Wednesday, 25 November the International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women, marks the beginning of the United Nations 16 Days of Activism against gender-based violence which ends on 10 December - Human Rights Day.

Human trafficking, a \$150 billion global industry, is one of the greatest examples of violence against women and girls. Millions of women and girls are forced to marry, or to work in slave-like conditions for little, or no pay and no chance of an education.

Join ACRATH and the international community for 16 days of activism against gender-based violence. Over the 16 Days of Activism ACRATH will be sharing stories, focusing on the people working in the areas of forced labour, forced marriage and supply chains, as well as creating opportunities for learning, prayer and reflection.
