NSW PREMIER REFUSES TO PROCLAIM THE MODERN SLAVERY ACT 2018

Read the email from Greg Donnelly MLC, Parliament of New South Wales who states that, "Instead of ensuring the legislation commences on 1st January 2021 as recommended by a parliamentary committee chaired and controlled by government members, the Premier and her Cabinet have decided to refer the matter off to secret negotiations."

CSSA CALLS FOR URGENT RETHINK ON JOBSEEKER CUTS

Read the <u>media release from Catholic Social Services Australia</u>, urging the Commonwealth Government to reconsider its plans to decrease the rate of JobSeeker payments from January 1, 2021. CEO Ursula Stephens explains that the temporary increase to the payment due to COVID-19 had a positive impact on the wellbeing of recipients but lowering the rate next month will resume a "long-term decline in the adequacy" of the payment. CSSA has also renewed its call for an independent panel to advise on meaningful reform of social security payment levels.
