CRA WRITES TO MINISTER RE COVID-19 VACCINATION FOR ELDERLY COMMUNITIES OF RELIGIOUS

Last week, CRA wrote to the Minister for Health and Aged Care, the Hon Greg Hunt MP, in relation to access to the COVID-19 vaccines for elderly members of religious institutes. CRA argued that they should be entitled to the same Commonwealth led in-reach workforce that will ensure residential aged care and disability care residents and staff receive their vaccines. VACCINES, VIRUSES AND VULNERABILITIES: CATHOLIC HEALTH AND CARE OF THE HUMAN PERSON


