In early February 2021, CRA and other organisations, urged the government to amend sections of the Fair Work Amendment (Supporting Australia's Jobs and Economic Recovery) Bill 2020 in a submission which would reduce and compromise vulnerable workers' rights. A revised Bill passed the House of Representatives yesterday. Most of our concerns were accepted by government and the Bill amended, which was a very positive result.
