JEWS, CHRISTIANS, MUSLIMS: HAND IN HAND

Lest the darkness of the conflict in the middle east eclipse our hope, we can remember the 'people power' on the ground that is consistently dedicated to peacebuilding initiatives. For example: <u>Hand In Hand</u> is a growing network of bilingual, integrated schools in Arab-Jewish communities in Israel. <u>EcoPeace</u> has



Israelis and Palestinians lobbying the governments of Israel, Jordan and the Palestinian Authority to better manage scarce water resources. <u>Project Rozana</u> and <u>Road to Recovery</u> have Israelis and Palestinians working together for improved health outcomes for Palestinian communities <u>The Parents Circle</u> brings together Israeli and Palestinian families who have each lost a child, killed by the 'other side'. Their personal stories convey a strong message: if *we* can reconcile, surely governments can too. Their stories can be shared as a beacon of hope.
