## **CRA CALLS FOR OVERHAUL OF ENVIRONMENTAL LAWS**

CRA recently lodged a submission urging the Federal Government to reconsider its proposed environmental law reforms following an inquiry into a bill that seeks to amend the Environmental Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999 (EPBC Act). Read the CRA media release here.

## HELP ABS TO GIVE HOMELESS PEOPLE A VOICE

The Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) is currently planning how best to ensure that homeless people feel empowered to have a voice and be counted in the forthcoming Census. CRA was approached to assist in the engagement of faith-based agencies who may be in a position to help provide the ABS with information or support in sensitively reaching out to homelessness people during the Census process. # **REFUGEE COUNCIL OF AUSTRALIA SUBMISSION**

The Refugee Council of Australia (RCOA) has recommended to the Federal Government that it boost its intake of refugees to 20,000 places by 2022–23, given the great reduction in recent years. The 2020-21 Program had a ceiling of 13,750 refugees – well down from the 18,750 places in 2018–19. This and other key recommendations can be found in the RCOA's submission regarding Australia's 2021–22 Humanitarian Program.

# PEOPLE'S INQUIRY LAUNCHED BY IPAN - HAVE YOUR SAY

The Independent and Peaceful Australia Network (IPAN) has launched a national inquiry into the costs and consequences of Australia's involvement in the U.S.-led wars, the U.S. alliance and its alternatives. Submissions can be made until 31 July 2021 through IPAN or take a 5-minute questionnaire.

# **CRA HEALTH & WELLBEING RESOURCES**


