POPE FRANCIS' INVITATION TO SHARE IN THE FORTHCOMING SYNODAL JOURNEY

CICLSAL has addressed a letter to consecrated men and women, containing an invitation from Pope Francis to "set out on an ecclesial journey" with the theme "For a Synodal Church: communion, participation, and mission". 145 UNBROKEN YEARS OF A MERCY PRESENCE IN YASS

<u>Catholic Voice</u> recently carried the story of the last Mercy Sister to leave Yass (in rural NSW) after 145 years of an unbroken presence of the Sisters of Mercy. That legacy included over a century of teaching in Yass's Catholic primary and secondary schools, ministering to inmates at the local jail, and visiting the poor and sick in homes and at the Yass hospital. A farewell Mass for the Sisters will be held at St Augustine's in Yass on 18 July.

"A PASSIONATE HEART" FOUNDATION LAUNCHED
