

#### **Event Brief**

#### Noel Pearson: From the Heart and Soul

This event celebrates a major joint resolution by diverse peak religious institutions, calling on Australian political leaders to take action on a First Nations voice referendum, as advocated by the Uluru Statement from the Heart.

It demonstrates a growing coalition of multicultural Australians accepting the invitation of the Uluru Statement to 'walk with' Indigenous Australians 'in a movement of the Australian people for a better future.'

This landmark cultural event at the Cutaway Biennale, Barangaroo, will feature an oration by Noel Pearson and will be broadcast to all Australians to help build momentum for a successful referendum.

### **Background**

Led by Dr Shireen Morris and Damien Freeman in partnership with Indigenous policy organisation Cape York Institute (spearheaded by Noel Pearson), and with generous support from Foundation Donors, Henry and Marcia Pinskier, Macquarie University Law School's Radical Centre Reform Lab is co-ordinating the joint resolution of peak Australian religious organisations in support of the Uluru Statement. Proposed signatories will include the:

The joint resolution will be launched on the  $5^{th}$  anniversary of the Uluru Statement – also the anniversary of the 1967 referendum, and the beginning of Reconciliation Week.

## **Proposed Event**

On the morning of 27 May 2022, Noel Pearson will give a landmark address at the Cutaway, Barangaroo, to promote the joint resolution and launch the Reform Lab.

Noel Pearson is Australia's most prominent and influential Indigenous leader. He is a writer and orator of international repute, who is passionate about empowering Indigenous Australians.

Aboriginal filmmaker, Rachel Perkins, is the creative director of this event. The NSW government have agreed to provide the Cutaway free of charge, to support this exciting occasion.

This event will be held against the dramatic backdrop of ancient rock walls at the Cutaway, amidst cutting edge contemporary art presented as part of Sydney's Biennale, and will hopefully be attended by members of many diverse religious denominations and cultural groups.
